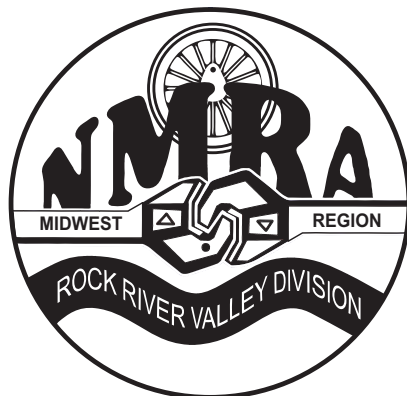

**Midway Village
Train Show 2009**

For the 16th year in a row, the Rock River Valley Division put on the Model Train Show at Midway Village Museum, held November 7 and 8, 2009. This year's show was deemed successful, however, attendance was substantially down from last year and down significantly for the third year in a row. This year, we had 549 for the two day event, compared with 742 in 2008 and 1076 in 2007.

I believe there are four reasons for the poor attendance. The first was the great "Indian Summer" weather that we never received in October but decided to visit during the train show weekend. When the weather is as nice as it was, many people would rather do outdoors activities than be inside. The second factor was kind of a strange one, i.e. a "competing" train show, the "S Fest". This S Gauge only show moves locations every year and this year it just happened to be in Rockford on the same dates as the RRVD MWV show. It is difficult to tell how many people may have attended that show rather than ours, but it probably was a factor, to some extent. The third reason effecting attendance, of course, has to be the general state of the economy. With the worst recession in many years still upon us, it certainly could have affected people's decisions to spend money on admission to the show. However, I believe the biggest factor for the poor attendance was the almost total lack of publicity. In previous years, we had newspaper, radio and TV coverage of the event either prior to or during the

weekend. This year we had basically nothing. As I have said before, the major promotional effort lies with the museum and we will need to work with them to improve publicity if we are going to enjoy better attendance in the future.

The makeup of the show was similar to last year, but on the downside, the Stateline S Guagers were unable to participate this year as they were, of course, at "S Fest" and we were hoping to have a large N Scale modular layout, but they turned out to be "no-shows", the first time such a thing has occurred in the 16 years of doing the show.

But enough of the bad news! On the positive side, Ralph Haines once again set up the outside riding train, the "Beaver Valley Lines", much to the delight of both young and old.

Returning for the fourth year in a row were the Midwest Rails G Scale layout and the Lake County Society of Modular Engineer's HO Layout, both excellent and popular displays.

Once again we also had the Fever River HO module, which features quality bench work and an excellent level of completeness of scenery.

Also, a big crowd pleaser was the Peterson family Lionel layout which has many buttons to press that operates trains and accessories to delight our guests.

New this year was the RRVD sponsored "Young Engineers" program which allowed youngsters to build an HO Freight Car kit, test run it on the "Rockford Route" layout and then take it home with them. This activity was greatly enjoyed by the 90 kids that signed up!

In addition to the above, there was a Z scale layout, one "timesaver" layout, one small N scale layout, three additional Lionel layouts, and one O scale switching layout. Complementing the layouts in all of these different scales were the National Railway Historical Society's slide shows and display table, RRVD display, railroadiana display, Argyle Club display, American Freedom Train display, videos and of course, perhaps most importantly, RRVD members and other model train enthusiasts, providing static displays and demonstrating modeling techniques.

Even though we had a number of issues to deal with this year, The Midway Village Museum Model Train Show remains a great opportunity for us to introduce our hobby to the general public, as well as to current train enthusiasts, in a museum setting, at the beginning of the model railroading season. In addition, it supports the not-for-profit institution that is home to our monthly membership meets and Board of Directors meetings. In closing, I would like to thank everyone who participated, assisted, promoted, and attended our show.

We couldn't have done it without you.

Thanks again to all!

P.S. Next year's show is November 6 & 7, 2010!

The Rock River Valley Division started a Video Library in January 2000. The Library now includes both video tapes and DVDs.

The Library is at a crucial point in it's history.

Do we continue The Library or abandon it?

We, the RRVD Library Committee, would like to know your wishes. At the January 3rd RRVD Meet there will be a ballot box for your vote on the future of The Library. Fill out the ballot at the Meet, or fill out and mail the ballot printed below, or let someone from the committee know your point of view.

Why is The Library at a crucial point?

First and foremost, no one volunteered to accept the vacant Librarian position and take care of the Library.

Historically, this is a very physical task. The Library has 131 tapes and 64 DVDs. They are stored in five plastic bins. The Librarian has to carry the heavy bins to and from each regular RRVD Meet. Then, there is the job of keeping track of who has borrowed tapes and DVDs. And, it can be an unpleasant chore to retrieve overdue videos!

Some suggest that a list of all tapes and DVDs in The Library may possibly be available to RRVD members so they could merely pick up and return their choices at the regular Meets. However, volunteers would still have to perform those revised Librarian tasks!

Second, there is a relatively low level of use of The Library. Some suggest that RRVD members are disinterest in The Library; hence, some conclude it should be discontinued. Others say the problem could be a combination of members not being aware of The Library plus it is not at every regular Meet.

Did you know that... for free... RRVD members can borrow as many videos as they want from one regular Meet to the next regular Meet... for one month... for FREE?

Third, many of the videos in The Library are VHS tapes. Most cannot be converted to DVDs due to copyrights. Some suggest that VHS tapes are ancient technology that should be sold or scrapped.

Please let us know your opinion at the January 3rd RRVD Meet. Interestingly, that will mark the 10th anniversary of The Library.

Please let us know what you think about The Library. Have a say.

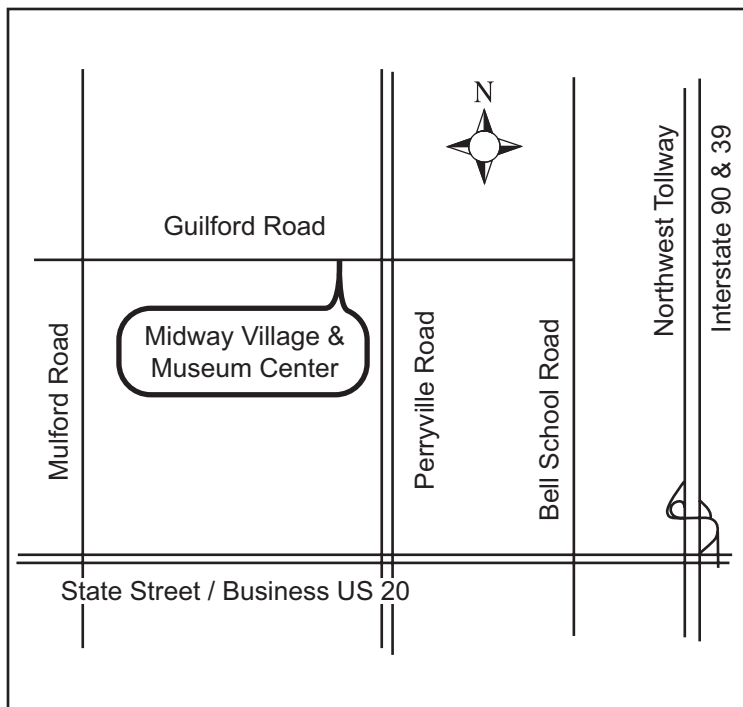
